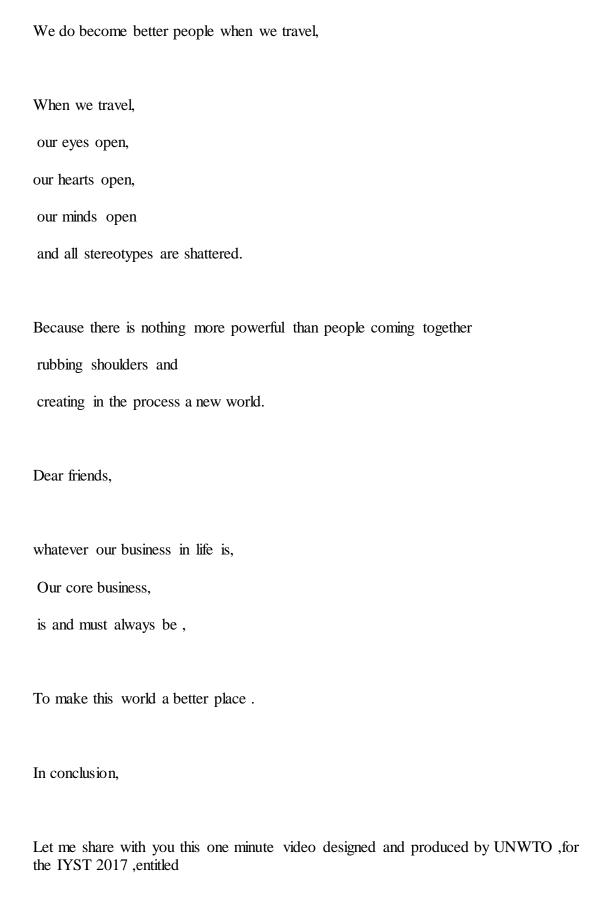
UNWTO is currently working with the Government of the Republic of Congo on the following two priorities of the strategy:
